CARLO'S

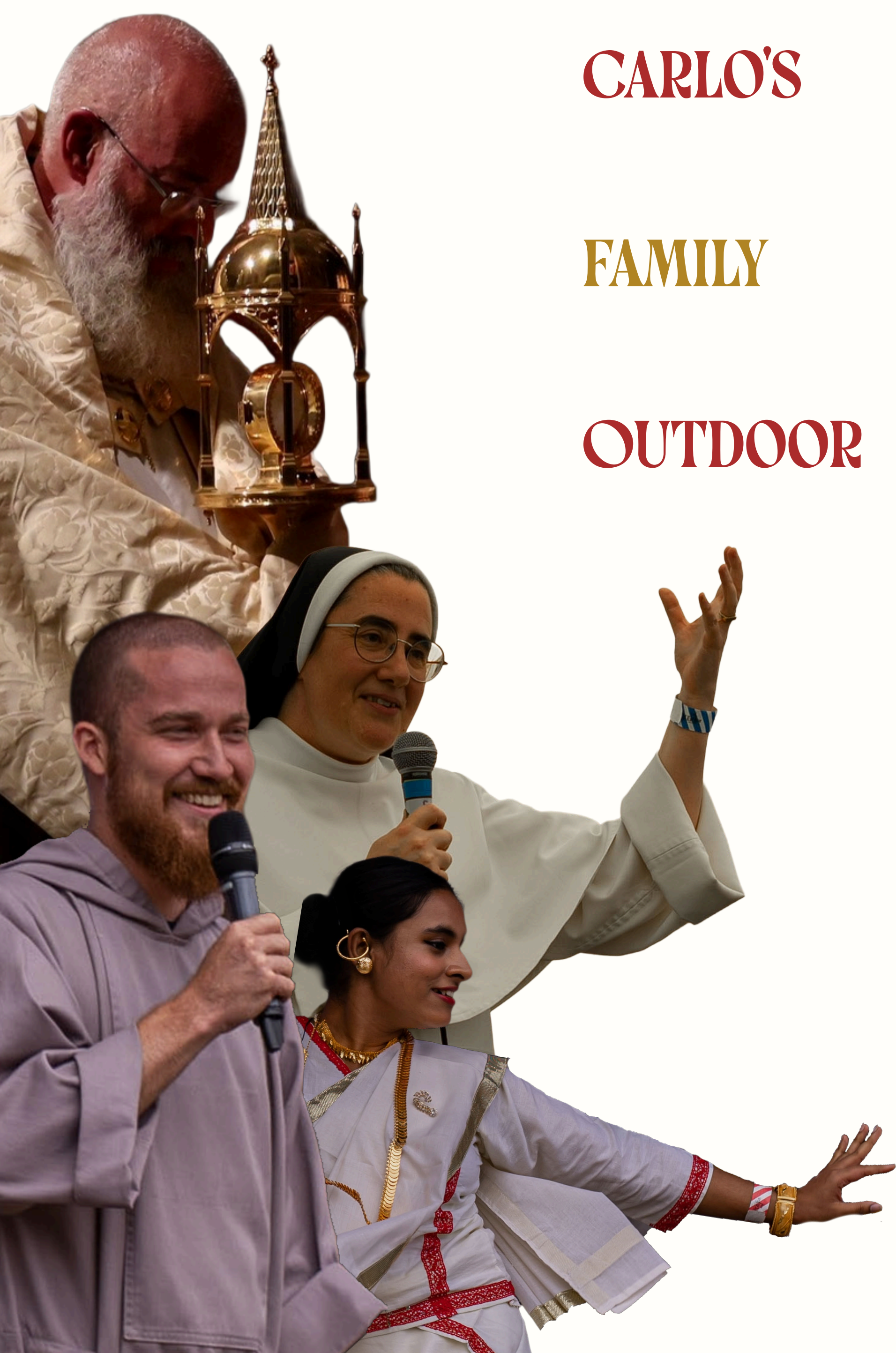

St Augustine of Hippo & the Eucharist.

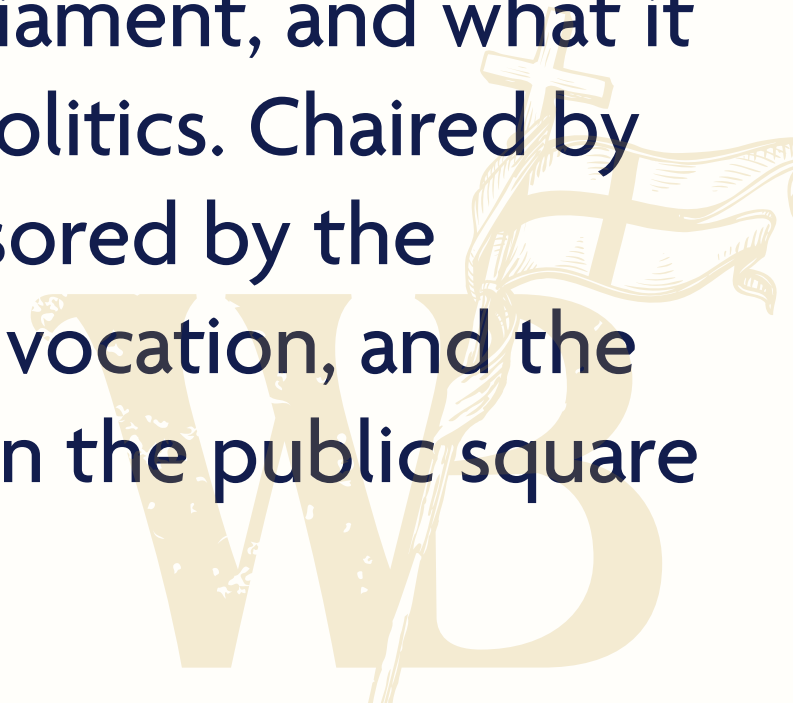
